EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2022-01

EXECUTIVE ORDER DECLARING A LOCAL STATE OF EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, imminent danger to residents and property located in the City of Altamonte Springs caused by Hurricane Ian is posed by the following conditions: severe weather; very high winds; heavy rain; possible tornadoes; and possible flooding; and

WHEREAS, said conditions have the potential for causing damage to public streets and roads, public drainage systems and commercial and residential buildings and areas; and

WHEREAS, Sections 252.38(2) and 252.38(3)(a)(5), *Florida Statutes*, provides authority for municipalities to declare a Local State of Emergency; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 16, "Emergency Management," *Altamonte Springs Code of Ordinances*, grants the authority to declare a local state of emergency to the City Manager of the City of Altamonte Springs, or the City Manager's designee.

NOW, THEREFORE, BY THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN ME, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

Section 1. Declaration of Local State of Emergency. Due to the imminent threat of severe weather; very high winds; heavy rain; possible tornadoes; and possible flooding caused by Tropical Depression 9, all of which poses a serious threat to the lives or property of the residents of City of Altamonte Springs, a Local State of Emergency is declared effective immediately. The Local State of Emergency will remain in effect within the legal boundaries of City of Altamonte Springs, Florida for seven (7) days from the date hereof and may be extended by Executive Order as necessary in seven (7) day increments.

Section 2. Waiver of Procedures and Formalities Otherwise Required. Due to the Local State of Emergency, effective immediately, the procedures and formalities required of the City by law or ordinance are hereby waived as they pertain to:

- (a) Performance of public work and taking whatever prudent action is necessary to ensure the health, safety and welfare of the community;
- (b) Entering into contracts;
- (c) Incurring obligations;
- (d) Employment of permanent and temporary workers;
- (e) Utilization of volunteer workers;
- (f) Rental of equipment;

- (g) Acquisition and distribution, with or without compensation, of supplies, materials and facilities; and
- (h) Appropriation and expenditure of public funds.

Section 3. Alterations or Rescission. This declaration of a Local State of Emergency may be altered or rescinded either by the issuance of a subsequent Executive Order or by an appropriate Resolution of the City of Altamonte Springs City Commission.
